Hiking: Hong Kong has around one thousand kilometres of maintained hiking trails – the possibilities for experiencing these less explored areas of Hong Kong are endless.

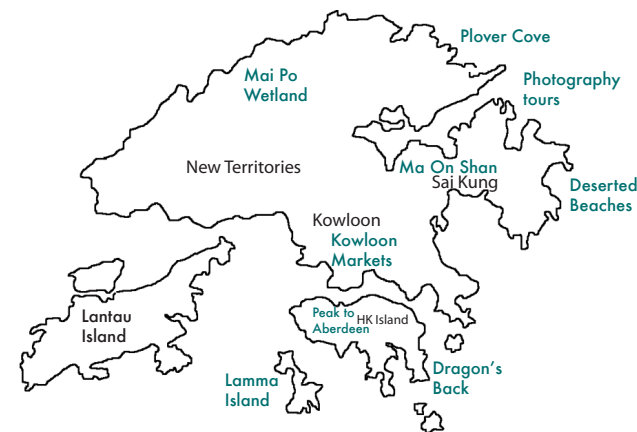

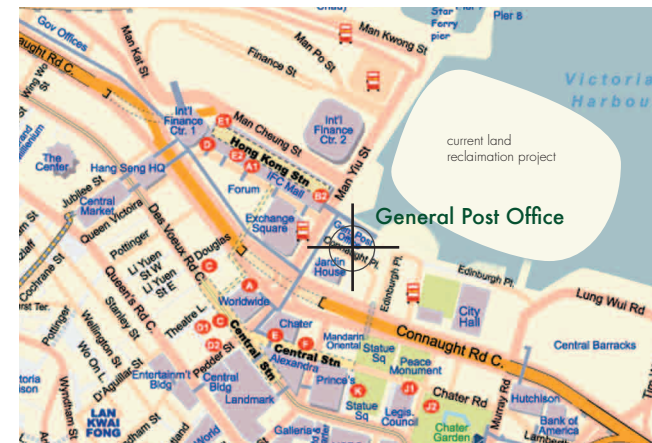
New Territories Tours: Bird-watching, photography and private tours have different meeting points. You will be advised of these when you book.

Start time: 8.30am



Outside the General Post Office, No 2 Connaught Place, Central, Hong Kong Island, at street level beside the green stamp-vending machines.

Directions from the MTR to the meeting point: Leave Central Station by Exit K. As you come to the top of the long escalator out of the station, turn right and immediately right again. Cross Chater Road at the pedestrian lights and go straight ahead through the pedestrian underpass. As you emerge at the other end, the GPO is ahead and to the left of you.

Heritage Walk - (Hong Kong Island) We visit historic buildings nestled among stunning skyscrapers and walk along streets whose very names evoke the colourful history of this amazing territory. As we walk you'll learn about Feng Shui, its importance to Chinese society and how it has shaped the development of Hong Kong. Our knowledgeable guides will unlock Hong Kong's past and show you how it plays a part in today's world. A great introduction tour to Hong Kong.

Peak towards Aberdeen Hike After crossing the vibrant business district, we ride the Peak Tram (funicular railway) to Victoria Peak (552m) We then walk to the wilder, quieter side of Hong Kong Island. Our path leads us through shaded forests and glades down to the south side of the island, passing along the historic 1863 Pok Fu Lam reservoir. Along the way we admire the distant views of Kowloon Peninsula, the South China Sea and its many islands. From here you can continue on to Aberdeen.

Cost: HK\$500 (including public transport) **Grade: moderate**
Total tour time 4½ hours **Walking distance: 7km**



Deserted Beaches Hike (Sai Kung East Country Park) These white sandy beaches with their clear blue waters are located in the New Territories' easternmost country park, where access is restricted to foot or boat. Our walk takes us along coastline backed by lush tropical vegetation and forested ridges, offering spectacular mountain and coastal views. Following a network of paths we pass fascinating old Hakka clan villages. Just 20km from Kowloon, this tour will make you feel a world away.

Cost: HK\$800 (including public transport) **Grade: moderate**
Total tour time 8½ hours **Walking distance: 11km**



Geopark Walk (Sai Kung East Country Park) This unique natural area explodes with special geological landscapes. As we walk along a sinuous coastline you will see a natural geological gallery, featuring spectacular rock formations shaped by waves and weathering. You will be amazed by the myriad of hexagonal volcanic column walls that make up one of the world's largest formations. Come and explore this unique area with us.

Cost: HK\$800 (including public transport) **Grade: moderate**
Total tour time 8½ hours **Walking distance: 4km**



Kowloon Markets Walk We start along the historic harbour front, where well-known landmarks such as 1881 Heritage and the Peninsula Hotel are situated. From here, we move on to the back streets of Kowloon and into the daily lives of local residents. Discover the energy and soul of everyday Kowloon as we thread our way through colourful streets to encounter some of its most lively markets.

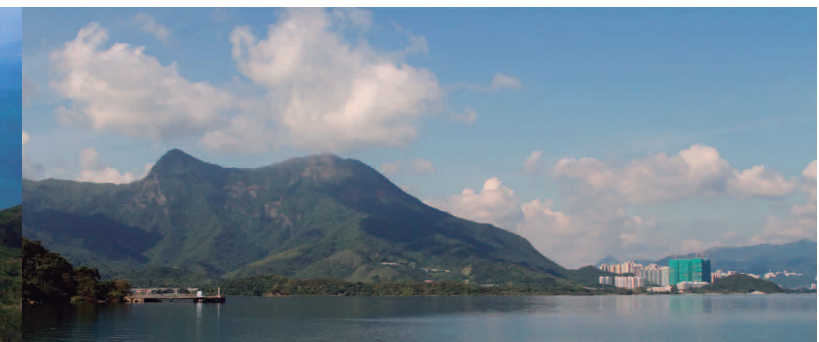
Dragon's Back Hike (Shek O Country Park) This trail was hailed by TIME magazine as Asia's best urban hike - "the city's finest and most surprising ramble" - and is Hong Kong's most popular walk. Our hike explores the serene and beautiful countryside on the eastern side of Hong Kong Island. The path takes us through bamboo groves, woodland and open hills often covered with wild azaleas or rose myrtle. The ridge of the Dragon's Back offers a breath-taking panorama of coastline and distant islands. Looking back, we take in the Tai Tam reservoirs, Stanley and Red Hill peninsula.

Cost: HK\$500 (including public transport) **Grade: moderate**
Total tour time 4 hours **Walking distance: 5km**



Lamma Island Hike Our journey starts at the colourful fishermen's quay in Aberdeen, where we take a slow ferry to Lamma, allowing us commanding views of southern Hong Kong Island. Joined by numerous butterflies we follow a coastal path on this peaceful, traffic-free island before ascending a hillside for majestic views. After visiting an atmospheric Tin Hau temple, we stop for a seafood lunch in Sok Kwu Wan. A scenic walk brings us to the interesting alleyways of Yung Shue Wan, from where we take the fast ferry back to Hong Kong Island.

Cost: HK\$800 (including public transport) **Grade: moderate**
Total tour time 7½ hours **Walking distance: 7km**



Ma On Shan Hike (Sai Kung West Country Park) Ma On Shan, or Horse Saddle Mountain, is part of the famous 100km MacLehose hiking trail. At 702m, Ma On Shan is one of the highest peaks in the New Territories. Our hike starts at sea level where we explore one of the abandoned villages at the base of the mountain before beginning our climb through lush green subtropical forest and dense exotic vegetation, to eventually come out at the low shrubland. Our hike ends in the charming fishing town of Sai Kung, where we can take in the local ambiance.

Meeting point: Choi Hung MTR Exit C.
Cost: HK\$800 (including public transport) **Grade: strenuous**
Total tour time 7 hours **Walking distance: 10km**
